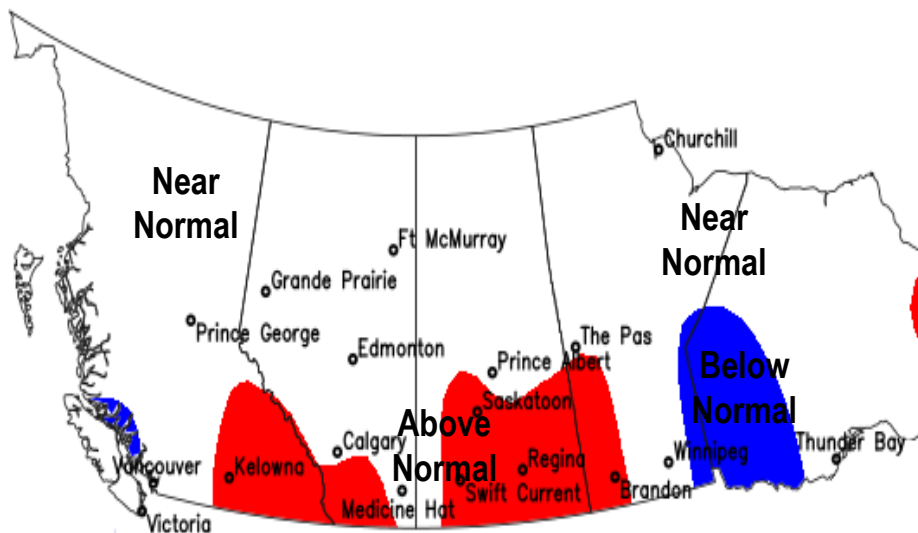
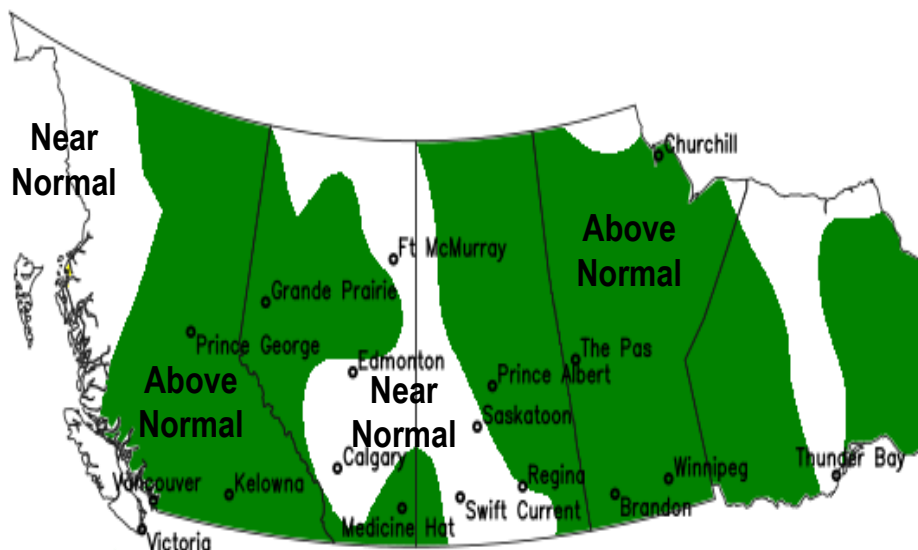

Monthly Climatic Outlook

A developing El Niño will help build a warm high pressure from the Northern Plains in the U.S. to the southern Prairies, in turn allowing cooler northwest flow into east-central Canada.

The main storm track will run along the periphery of the high pressure, causing increased rainfall for the western Prairies from mid-month onward. The East will be wet most of the month.
