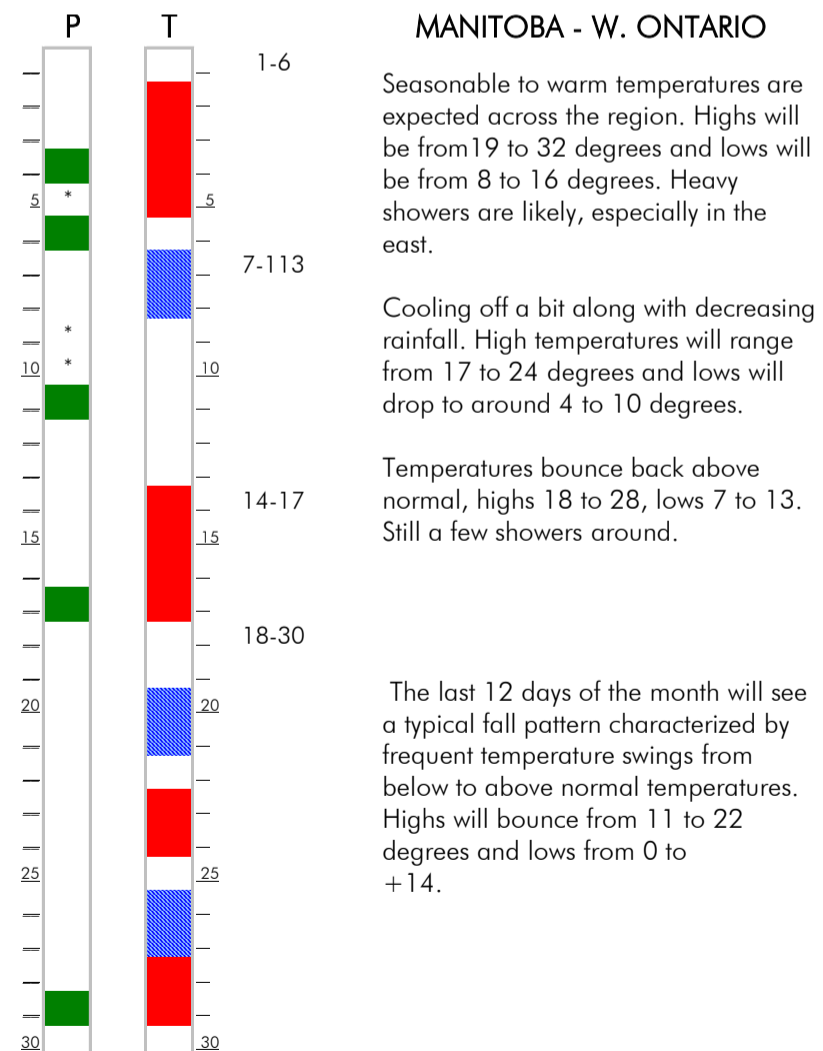
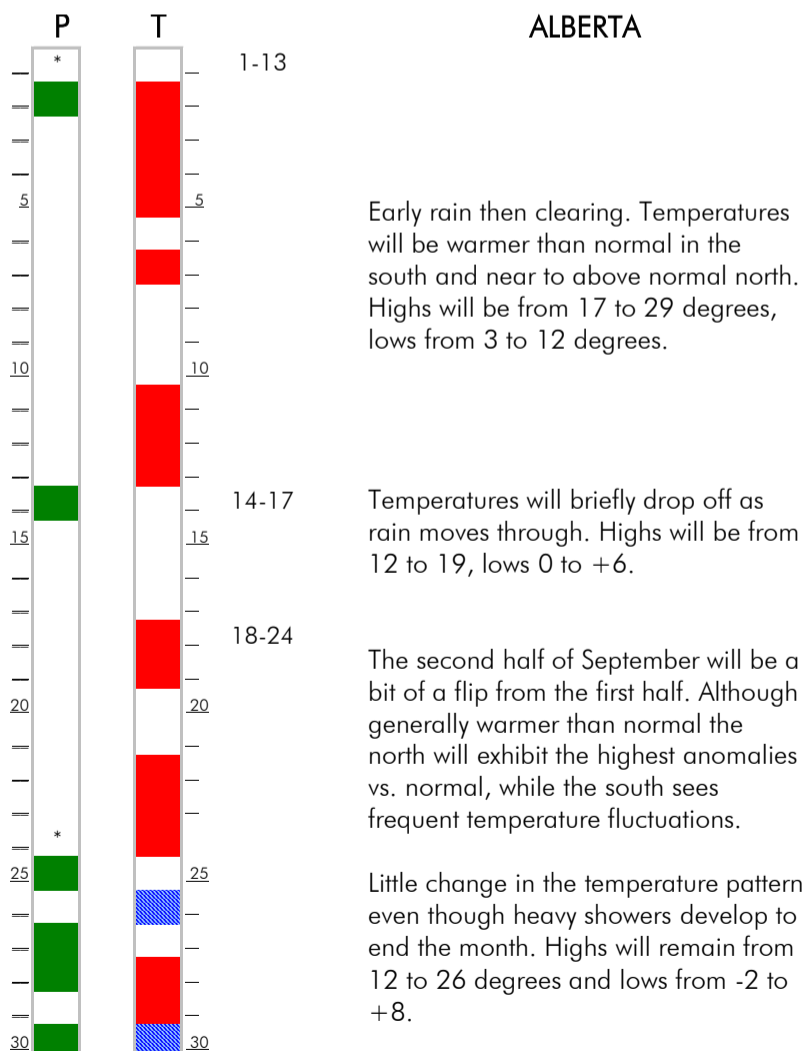
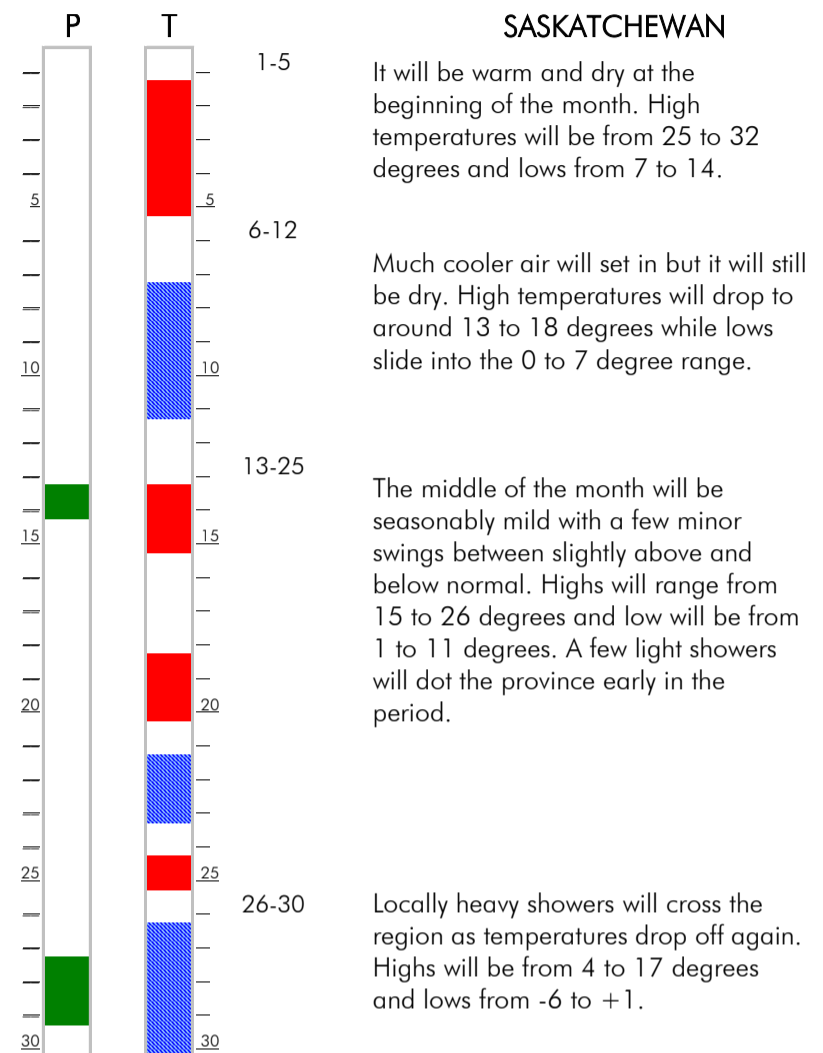
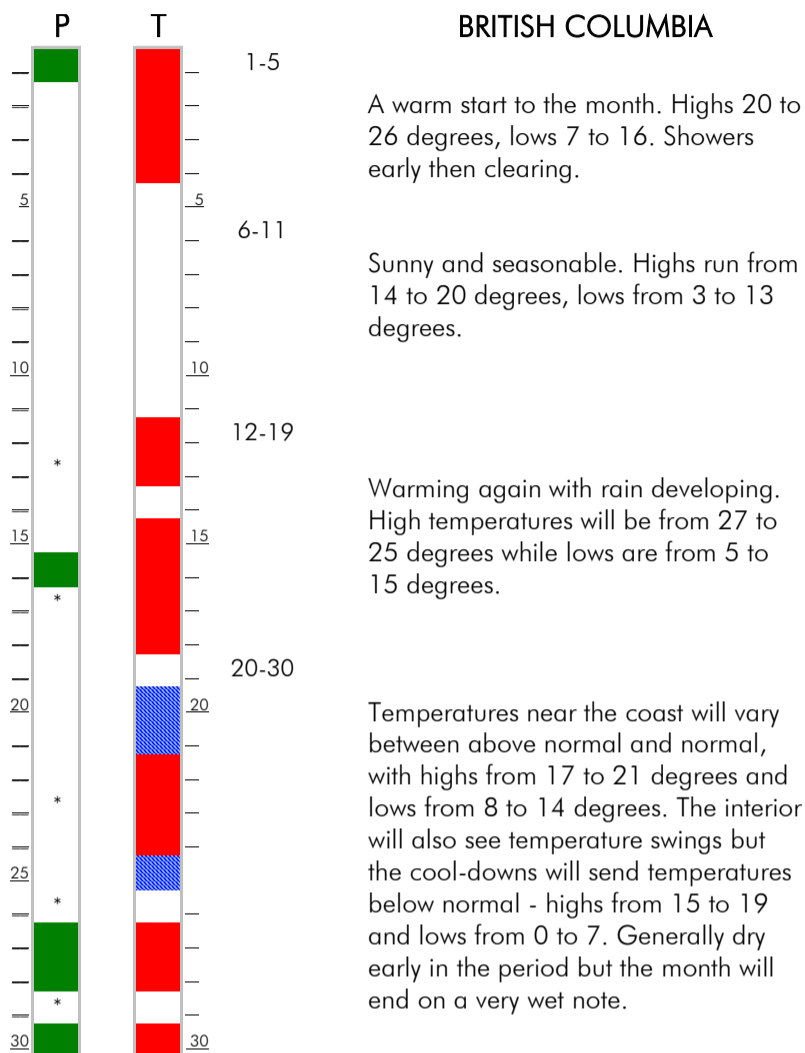
Precipitation



Monthly Climatic Outlook

The West will generally have above normal temperatures through the month. Eastern areas will see more fall-like volatility, averaging closer to normal. Much of the Prairies will see near normal rainfall with higher amounts in the western and eastern fringes.
